Sen. Kashim Shettima was born into the family of Shettima Mustafa Kuttayibe on 2 September 1966 in Maiduguri. He graduated from the University of Maiduguri where he obtained a B.Sc in Agricultural Economy.

He is Nigeria's Vice President. The 57-year-old started his working life as a university lecturer. He later became a banker before quitting in 2007 to join politics.

He attended Lamisula Primary School in Maiduguri from 1972-1978. He started secondary school at Government Community Secondary School in Biu in the southern part of Borno State from 1978 to 1980 but later transferred to Government Science Secondary School, Potiskum, where he completed his secondary

Shettima became the governor without setting out to be one. He was brought in as a replacement after the winner of the governorship candidate of the All Nigerian People's Party (ANPP) Modu Fannami-Gubio was shot dead by Boko Haram insurgents in January 2011.

After he emerged as Mr Gubio's replacement, he was accused of masterminding the killing of the late candidate. But the allegation did not stop him from being elected governor.

The allegation of having a hand in the death of Mr Fannami-Gubio continued even after his first term in office. He repeatedly denied any involvement in the murder.

At the end of his tenure, he contested and won the election to represent Borno Central District in the Senate. On 20 July 2022, he was appointed the running mate of the presidential candidate of the APC, Bola Tinubu.

Bola Tinubu's choice of Mr Shettima surprised many people but the former governor has always been a "Tinubu man".

"My choice of Shettima is borne out of the urgent need to address the challenges facing the country and Shettima possesses strong leadership abilities which he exhibited when he was the governor of Borno State. I wanted a progressive government that was why I selected Shettima," President Tinubu said.



Godswill Obot Akpabio, the 15th President of the Nigerian Senate. by dint of hardwork, committed service to the people at any station in life that he has found himself, and the grace of the Almighty God, has risen to become a prominent figure in Nigerian politics as the President of the 10th Senate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria and the Chairman of Nigeria's National Assembly and by implication the head of the Legislative Arm of Government.

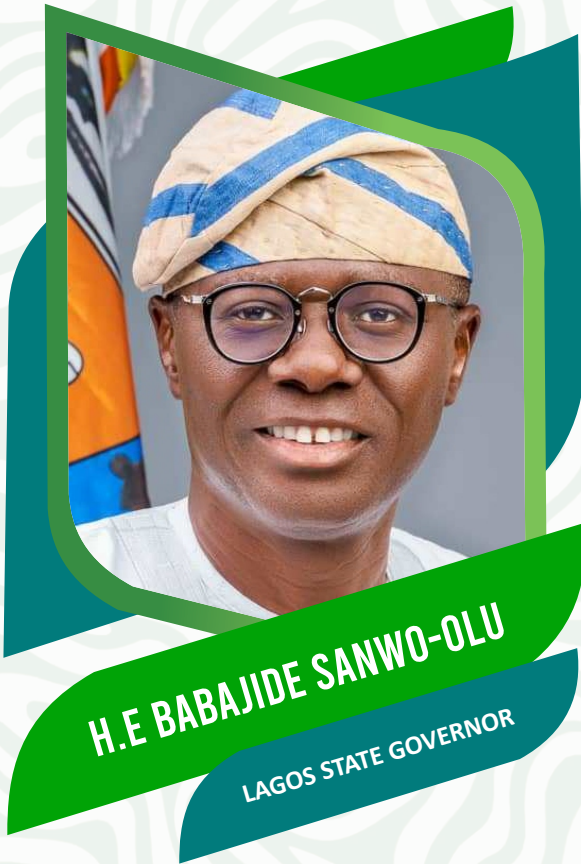
In the course of his illustrious career in the private sector, Akpabio held various positions of influence and responsibility. He served as the Director of Corporate Affairs and Legal Services at EMIS Telecoms Limited, a wireless telecommunications company in Lagos. He

later rose to the position of the Managing Director/Chief Executive Officer of the pioneer fixed wireless telecommunications company. In this position, he helped in shaping the future of the burgeoning telecommunication industry. EMIS was the forerunner of today's telecommunication companies like Glo, MTN, Airtel, 9mobile and others.

On April 24, 2007, Chief Akpabio was massively elected as the Governor of Akwa Ibom State and took the oath of office on May 29, 2007 as the third elected Governor of Akwa Ibom State. His stellar performance in the first term secured his overwhelming re-election for a second term in 2011 despite opposition which was based on primordial sentiments.

As the Governor of Akwa Ibom State indeed God's will was done in all facets of life in the State through massive infrastructural development, education, health care, rural development and human capacity building. His administration's achievements earned him overwhelming support from the people, who gave him the sobriquet, "Uncommon Transformer."

One of the very significant achievement of his administration as the Governor of Akwa Ibom State was his declaration that no Akwa Ibom child should suffer what he went through with the struggle of his mother to pay his school fees through his declaration of non discriminatory free and compulsory education for all Nigerian children living in Akwa Ibom from primary to senior secondary school level.



Mr. Babajide Olusola Sanwo-Olu was elected the Governor of Lagos State on the platform of the All Progressives Congress (APC).

His victory at the election is a solid endorsement of his leadership aptitude and the All Progressives Congress (APC) politics of development and inclusiveness in Lagos State. As an inspirational leader, with a track-record of performance, his candidacy was welcomed by Lagosians as a continuation of ongoing development in Lagos State.

Mr. Sanwo-Olu, who was born on June 25, 1965 in Lagos State, is a reliable party man and astute politician, who is

reputed for his people-centered ideology. His foray into public service started after decades of accomplishments in the private sector, especially the Nigerian banking sector, from where he retired as a General Manager. This accomplished private sector expert, whose innovative mind quickly established as an exemplary public sector reformer, started his early education at Government Demonstration School, Surulere and Ijebu-Ife Grammar School, Ogun State.

In 2003, his eventful career opened to yet another colorful chapter with his appointment, first as Special Adviser to the Deputy Governor on Corporate Matters; and later as Special Adviser to the Executive Governor on Corporate Matters in 2004. His Excellency, Mr. Sanwo-Olu's entry became a reference point for professionalism and excellence in the public service. At 39, he was appointed acting Commissioner for Economic Planning & Budget from 2004 to 2005, and became the substantive Commissioner for Commerce and Industry in 2007 following his exceptional performance.

His managerial imprint became noticeable at the Lagos State Ministry of Establishments, Training and Pensions in 2007 when he served as the Commissioner.

A public officer with an impressive record of accomplishments, he was instrumental to the setting-up of Lagos State Pension Commission (LASPEC), a contributory pension scheme, even ahead of the Federal Government of Nigeria.



Eng. Abdullahi Audu Sule is the incumbent Governor of Nasarawa State, currently serving his second term in office. A politician, engineer, and businessman, he was first elected in 2019 under the All Progressives Congress (APC) platform and was re-elected in 2023

Born on December 26th, 1959 in Gudi Station, Akwanga-west development area of Nasarawa state. I was brought up in this small, but multi-ethnic and multi-religious village. My father, Alhaji Sule is the current traditional ruler (Hakimi) while my grandfather, Abdullahi Angulu was the first traditional ruler of Gudi station. My mother, Hajiya Hauwa was brought up in Bokono and Keffi, Nasarawa state.

My work experience began in 1980 when I was offered employment by the Plateau

electricity Corporation, Jos even before my graduation in may 1980. While at Indiana, state university upon my return from the USA, I did my national service, NYSC with the plateau utilities board, jos and later joined the jos steel Rolling company ltd in 1985 as a production Engineer.

In 1987 I was accelerated promotion from GL 9 to GL 12 in recognition of my performance and hard work. I left jos steel rolling company as a principal production engineer in 1989 and returned to the USA.

worked in various capacities from workshop engineer computer Numerical control (CNC) programmer, CNC operator, Facilities Engineer, project/ production engineer and finally the director of business development for Africa and the middle east for osyka corporation.

I returned to Nigeria in the year 2000 and along with some friends started a company called sadiq Petroleum Nigeria limited in lagos. I was made the pioneer managing Director/ CEO.

Since my return to Nigeria in 2000, I have participated in several private and public projects in Nasarawa State. I have also invited and funded prospective foreign investors to come and take a look at the prospects of our state. I have participated and/ or single handedly renovated and build schools, clinics, houses of worship, security posts, now Ag GMD dangote sugar refinery lagos.



Hajiya Imaan Sulaiman-Ibrahim is the Honourable Minister of Women Affairs, appointed to oversee the affairs of the Federal Ministry of Women Affairs. With a strong background in public service and a passion for women's empowerment, she is committed to advancing gender equality, protecting women's rights, and implementing policies that promote the welfare of women and children across Nigeria.

Imaan Sulaiman-Ibrahim is a Nigerian politician and businesswoman. She was the director-general of National Agency for the Prohibition of Trafficking in Persons, NAPTRIP from 1 December 2020 till 27 May 2021, when the Nigerian President, Muhammadu Buhari announced a swap and she was

redeployed as the Honourable Federal Commissioner of the National Commission for Refugees, Migrants, and Internally Displaced Persons.

August 2023 – October 2024: She was the Minister of State, Police Affairs, the first woman in this role.

Imaan Sulaiman-Ibrahim started her career working at Abuja Geographic Information Systems, AGIS, before moving to the United Kingdom where she worked in human resource, Business and Management before becoming a certified [SAP] HCM consultant. Sulaiman-Ibrahim joined Mary Kay and later became a senior sales director. She was a special adviser on strategic communication to the minister of state for education, Chukwuemeka Nwajiuba and she was appointed a member of the Nasarawa State economic advisory council by the Executive Governor of Nassarawa State Engr. A. A. Sule in September 2019.

Imaan Sulaiman-Ibrahim was raised in Abuja, Nigeria. She attended Aruwa Nursery School, Abuja and Jabi Primary School, (now, LEA Primary School, Jabi), for her nursery and primary school education before preceding to Federal Government Girls College, Bwari, Abuja for her secondary education. At the age of 19, she graduated from University of Abuja with a degree in sociology. At the age of 21, she received two master's degrees from Webster University, an MBA and MA. She did her mandatory National Youth Service Corps at NNPC, Kaduna zonal office

Hon. Dr. Yetunde Adeniji is a Senior Special Assistant to the President of Nigeria, Bola Ahmed Tinubu, focusing on the School Feeding Programme. In this role, she is a strong advocate for inclusive development and women's empowerment, particularly for women at the grassroots level.

Her work also focuses on reaching vulnerable groups, such as children with

disabilities and those in internally displaced persons (IDP) camps. **Advocate for women in governance:** In July 2025, she participated in a strategic roundtable on the "Reserved Seats for Women Bill," where she spoke on the importance of increasing women's representation in national decision-making.

Intergovernmental cooperation: She has represented the presidency in meetings with state governors and other officials to align national initiatives with local efforts. For instance, in 2024, she visited Jigawa State to discuss the Renewed Hope agenda with Governor Umar Namadi.

Engaging with children: She frequently interacts with the young beneficiaries of the school feeding program. In 2025, she visited Queen Amina College in Kaduna, where she served and ate with students, offering them words of encouragement.

Expansion of school feeding programs: Anambra State, Zamfara State and Plateau State.

Awards: In August 2025, she was honored with the Democracy Newline Newspaper Excellent Leadership Award for her dedication to the school feeding program.

Youth development: In June 2025, her office supported the Child's Cultural Rights & Advocacy Trust Agency (CCRATA) Kids Summer Boot Camp in Oyo State, which provided vocational lessons and skill-building for children



Before becoming DG, he held the position of Senior Special Assistant to the Governor on Humanitarian Services and was the Focal Person for the National Social Investment Programme (NSIP) in Nasarawa State.

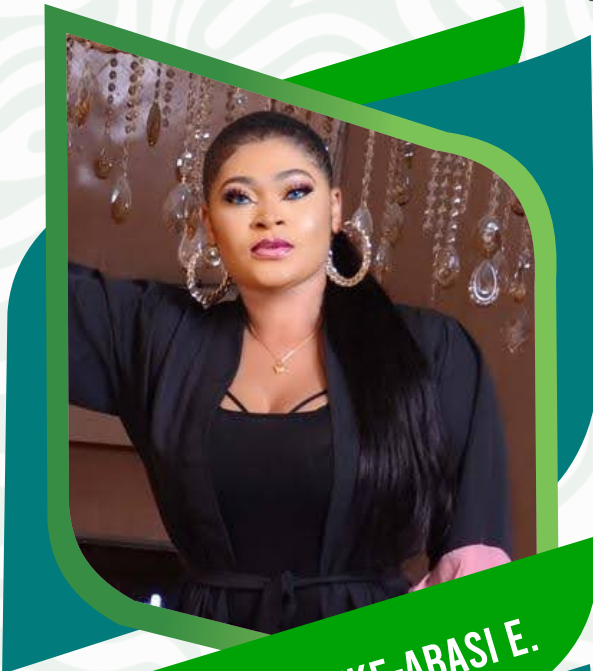
In his role at NSSIA, Hon. AREA OF PRIORITY

Our objectives are centered around meeting urgent needs, driving systemic change, and empowering communities to thrive independently.

Guided by our unwavering humanitarian principles, the Foundation pursues the following core objectives:

1. Hunger Eradication and Food Security (Mo'Feed Initiative):

To combat hunger and malnutrition by implementing large-scale food distribution programs across Nigeria, with the goal of feeding at least 600,000 vulnerable individuals across the six geopolitical zones. Our

objective is to ensure that no child, woman, or elderly person goes to bed hungry, especially among internally displaced persons (IDPs), low-income communities, and rural populations.

2. Child Welfare and Protection:

Our Advocacy Focus

The Boy Child Life Matters Initiative is designed to address the emerging social, psychological, educational, and moral gaps affecting boys today. Our advocacy aims to:

1. Promote the Holistic Development



of the Boy Child

We advocate for the boy child to be raised in an environment that values his emotions, identity, aspirations, and mental health. We seek to:

- i. Challenge toxic masculinity and societal pressures that discourage boys from expressing vulnerability or seeking help.
- ii. Encourage balanced upbringing that fosters empathy, discipline, responsibility, and respect for others.
- iii. Create platforms where boys can receive mentorship, guidance, and life-building skills from positive male role models.

2. Address Neglect, Abuse, and Exploitation of Boys

Top Priority Programs Under "Boy Child Life Matters"

The Safe Boys Hub

A mobile, pop-up center where boys can walk in and get:

- I. Mentorship sessions from real male role models
- ii. Mental health support with licensed counselors on site
- iii. Free meals, educational kits, and a warm conversation with someone who sees them

We're piloting this in Lagos, Abuja, and Port Harcourt before scaling nationwide.

Rescue to Reform (R2R) Project

Boys rescued from drug dens, street gangs, or cult groups are:

- I. Given a second chance through intensive rehab and counseling
- ii. Enrolled in vocational and creative skill programs
- iii. Partnered with older male mentors from their own communities who once walked that same path but found a way out

The "Dear Son" Campaign

An emotional digital & media storytelling campaign where:

- I. Fathers, mothers, celebrities, survivors, and mentors write or record letters to the boy child
- ii. These letters are compiled and read in schools, shelters, churches, and online

The campaign will culminate in a National Boy Child Affirmation Day, where boys across Nigeria gather to be reminded: "You Matter. You Are Seen. You Are Loved."

✓ School Retention for At-Risk Boys

We will work with schools and local communities to:

- i. Identify boys who have dropped out due to poverty or home crises
- ii. Provide scholarships, uniforms, school meals, and transportation
- iii. Pair them with community mentors who follow up and check in monthly

We're targeting at least 10,000 boys by 2026.

✓ The Boy Code Series

A dynamic workshop held in secondary schools, churches, mosques, and youth centers, teaching boys:

- i. Emotional intelligence
- ii. Respect for women
- iii. Responsible sexuality
- iv. Career discovery
- v. How to say no to drugs, cultism, and abuse

Each session ends with a pledge and a boy-to-man toolkit a branded guidebook that includes real-life survival lessons, inspirational letters, and safe contact channels.

Why It Matters?

Because boys who are not nurtured become men who are broken and broken men raise broken societies. Because when we raise empowered boys, we raise:

- i. Fathers who love instead of lash
- ii. Husbands who protect instead of punish
- iii. Leaders who serve instead of suppress
